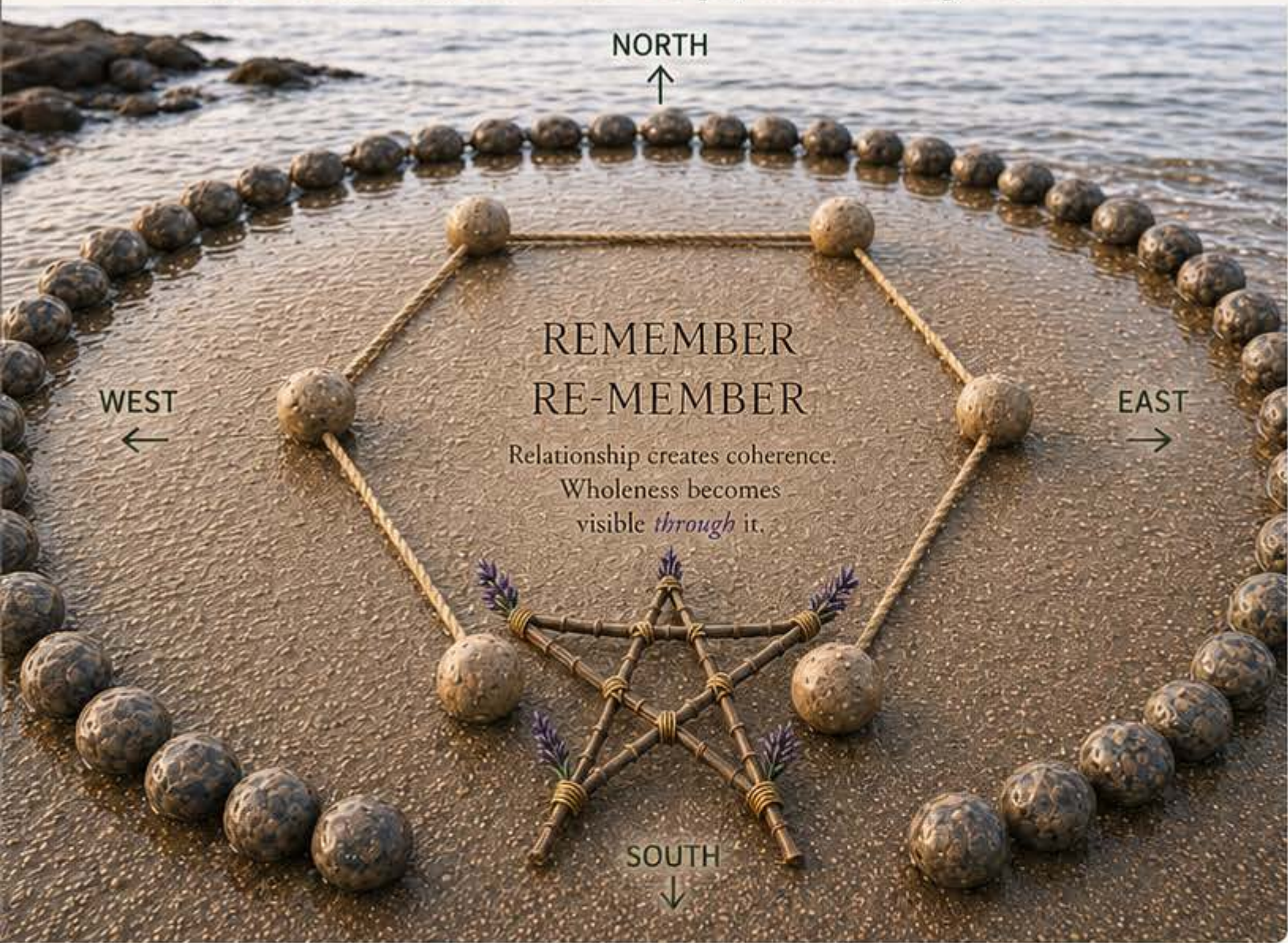


CIRCLE • HEXAGON • STAR

A LIVING TEMPLE OF RELATIONSHIP

*A ceremony of remembering our relationship to a larger wholeness.
Held at the Salish Sea Floor's Water Temple, within the Dragon's watershed.*



The circle is the existing whole.
The circle is the larger container already present in the landscape. It holds the ceremony.



The hexagon is the relational matrix.
The hexagon is the relational matrix of the circle. It defines the field where relationship is tended and remembered.



The star moves with purpose.
The star descends into the field and sequentially touches each of the six points of the hexagon. Through relationship, the star and field remember one another. Through contact, the field becomes coherent.



Water dissolves the boundaries.
The sand spheres that define the hexagon are dissolved with water. The temporary matrix returns to the circle.



The circle remains.
What remains is the larger whole. The field is re-membered into its true relationship.

THE RIDDLE AS CEREMONIAL CODE

The word **REMEMBER** brackets the code.
The message lives within. The code is the ceremony.

REMEMBER SYSTEMS THAT BREAK MATTER FALL APART. REMEMBER.

REMEMBER STARS CANNOT FALL UNLESS THERE IS AN UNDERSTANDING OF OTHERS. REMEMBER.

Inside the hexagon: **REMEMBER** • **RE-MEMBER**
Inside the circle: **REMEMBERED** • **RE-REMEMBERED**

CORE INSIGHT

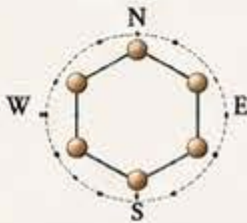
The star is not above the field.
It is revealed through relationship within it.
Relationship creates curvature in the field—just as pentagons and hexagons together create a sphere.



THE CEREMONY SEQUENCE

1 ALIGN

Orient the hexagon to the four directions (N, E, S, W) within the circle.



2 WRITE

Write in the sand inside the hexagon:
REMEMBER
RE-MEMBER



3 DESCEND

Place the standing star inside the hexagon.



4 TOUCH

Move the star around the hexagon, pressing the two lower points into each of the six positions in turn.



5 DISSOLVE

Dissolve the sand spheres with water. The hexagon disappears.



6 RE-MEMBER

Etch in the sand inside the circle:
REMEMBERED
RE-REMEMBERED



NOTES ON PROPORTION & MEANING

- The circle (natural stone ring) defines the maximum size and holds the ceremony.
- The hexagon (sand spheres) defines the working scale within the circle.
- The star (wood and plant) is built from those dimensions.
- The two lower points of the star are anchored to the lower vertices of the hexagon.
- Distances are set so the star's two lower points match the spacing between adjacent hexagon points.

THE REMEMBERING

The hexagon remembers it belongs to the circle.
The star remembers it was never separate from the field.
Together they re-member the wholeness that has always been.

THE ESSENCE

Shape reveals relationship.
Relationship reveals belonging.
The ceremony helps us remember the wholeness already here.



The ceremony is the remembering. The remembering is the relationship. The relationship is the return to wholeness.
